A Short History of the Restoration Movement

For me, history is vital for understanding my identity in relationship with Christ and with other Christians. More so, church history gives us insight into not only who we are but also mistakes to learn from and insight to move forward. This short essay sketches history of the Restoration

movement, of which, Lake Ridge Christian Church came from.

The Stone-Campbell tradition finds its roots in a Calvinist Presbyterian Church named after its founders and early leaders: Barton Stone and Alexander Campbell. Today this tradition is represented by three groups: the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), the Christian Churches and Churches of Christ, and the Acapella Churches of Christ. The movement itself began in the Appalachian frontier.

The objective for Campbellites, inheritors the Restoration movement, is to restore Christian unity through abolishing creeds and returning to the principles of the early churches described in the New Testament. This means that these churches sought simplicity in their worship, bible studies, and church organization as they learned to accept the gift of the Kingdom of God and enact it in their own lives.

Some of the central beliefs of our movement are as follows: Jesus is the Christ, the son of God. Christians should have communion each Sunday. Baptism of adult believers by immersion in water is a necessary step toward salvation.

So at the end of this you may be asking yourself, so are we a denomination? The simple answer is no. To have a denomination implies one's religious organization has both an institutional hierarchy that the local church is under the supervision of creeds. We have neither.

My hope is that this brief sketch of Restoration Movement peaks your curiosity. Understanding church history is vital to understanding yourself as a Christian as well as understanding other brothers and sisters. By understanding your faith tradition, you will add to your relationship with Christ as you learn from brothers and sisters and in the past. It will also add to your relationship with Christ as you learn to understand other brothers and sisters in the present. This wonderful process begins by first understanding your own history.
